- Write the letter. It can be handwritten (legibly), typed, printed, or emailed.
- If you plan to include photos, locate them and, if you can, email (digital is best) to Sue at <a href="mailto:sue@sailtoday.org">sue@sailtoday.org</a> (If you can't email, just bring them!)
- Make an appointment with the SAIL staff to have your letter reviewed, edited, and finalized. (Letter and photos need to be to the SAIL office at least one week prior to your appointment time so we have time to do a draft for you.)
- Purchase any special paper you might want to use and bring it with you to the appointment.

During your appointment, you can review a draft of your letter and recommend changes you'd like made. We can make copies for you at the conclusion of your appointment. Appointments can be made between 9:00 a.m. and noon, Monday through Thursday during the weeks of November 13, November 27, and December 4. #### Men's Roundtable by Member Fred Ross


When and Where: Tuesday, November 14 at 10:00 a.m. in the Heritage Oaks Social Room at Oakwood Village University Woods.
